

PARKING Ordinance

Adopted: Sept. 5, '61
Published: Aug. 17, '61 in Somerset Mess. Gaz.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON CERTAIN STREETS IN THE BOROUGH OF MILLSTONE, COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Millstone, County of Somerset, New Jersey.

Section 1. The stopping, standing or parking of vehicles for any period of time on and along the following designated portions of Main Street, in the Borough of Millstone, be and the same is hereby prohibited:

A. On the east side of Main Street a distance of 200 feet southerly from its intersection with the curb line on the southerly side of Amwell Road, (which intersection of Main Street and Amwell Road is at the property of John Panitierre.)

B. On the west side of Main Street a distance of 200 feet southerly and 150 feet northerly from its intersection with the prolongation of the curb line on the southerly side of Amwell Road, (which intersection of Main Street and Amwell Road is at the property of John Panitierre).

Section 2. Any person who shall violate this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to a fine of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen days, or both.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption and publication according to law.

The foregoing ordinance was introduced at a regular meeting of the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone on Tuesday, August 1, 1961, and will be considered for final passage after public hearing at a regular meeting of the Borough Council of the Borough of Millstone at the Borough Hall, in the Borough of Millstone on Tuesday, September 5, 1961.
